Covid-19 LG additional funding allocations

Local authorities are best placed to understand what the service pressures and spending needs are in their local area, so this funding will not be ringfenced and can be allocated to Covid-19 pressures in whatever way individual authorities feel is appropriate to their pressures.

The £1.6bn additional funding has been distributed using two mechanisms:

- £1.39bn has been distributed using the existing Adults Social Care Relative Needs Formula. The Adult Social Care Relative Needs Formula is an estimate of relative needs for adult social care services across authorities and in recent years has been used as the basis for distribution of grant funding for both children's and adult social care services.

-£0.21bn has been distributed via authorities' share of 2013/14 Settlement Funding Assessment or overall relative needs. This is the basis on which we have recently distributed several pots of funding to authorities, including the recently announced distribution of the 2019/20 business rates retention levy surplus
