
Rough sleeping in England

- Regional and local authority numbers of rough sleepers in England
- Since 2010, local authorities in England have estimated rough sleeper numbers through either a count or an estimate based on contact with local organisations.
- In autumn 2016 there were an estimated 4,134 rough sleepers in England. This is the highest figure since 2010 and is a 16% increase on the previous year.
- 964 of these rough sleepers were in Greater London (23% of the England total).
