One way I've made a difference as a nurse or midwife

Social prescribing provides a conduit that promotes personalised approaches through salutogenic principles, focusing on the health and wellbeing health of a range of populations. As the lead for the National Social Prescribing Network Nursing Group (SIGSPN), I have led key organisations across professional, education and voluntary sectors to share how personalised, salutogenic approaches can be embedded into the nursing curriculum through unique leaning experiences in the third sector. My work and research with the Community Voluntary Sector and Health Education England has facilitated the co-creation of 'social prescribing' learning experiences that enable student nurses to appreciate asset-based approaches and experience how personalised care positively influences the community and individuals. Empowering nurses through these innovative education methods and sharing good practice, can help redress the existing, traditional pathogenic approach and facilitate a sustainable difference for a wide range of communities, organisations and individuals.
